# MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE SCHOOL BOARD INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT 271 Bloomington, Minnesota

### October 24, 2022

I. ROLL CALL

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, and there being a quorum present, the School Board meeting of Independent School District 271 was called to order by Chair Tom Bennett at 7:00 p.m. on October 24, 2022, in the Arlene Bush Board Room at the Educational Services Center, 1350 West 106<sup>th</sup> Street, Bloomington, Minnesota.

Chair Bennett acknowledged that Bloomington Public Schools rests on the traditional, ancestral and contemporary land of the Dakota. The name of our state is Mni Sota Makoce, Land where the waters reflect the skies or clouds. Mni means water; Sota means clear, but not perfectly so, cloudy. Makoce means a place, land, or country. Recognizing the land is an expression of gratitude and appreciation to those whose territory we reside on and a way of honoring the Indigenous people.

III. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Matt Dymoke moved and Dawn Steigauf seconded, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

IV. RECOGNITIONS

Student School Board Representative Reports Janie Andersen reported on tonight's Board Student Advisory Council meeting with high school representatives; topics were substance abuse in/out of school and student/staff relationships. She highlighted recent activities at Jefferson including the homecoming coronation, game and dance, Unity Day with a stand up against bullying theme, recent Jefferson Theatre performances of *Tinkerbell*, upcoming marching band/flag performances, blood drive on November 3 and tomorrow night's football game.

Kelly Olson reported on Kennedy High School fall sports and activities, including honors—Kennedy girls soccer head coach Mario Lone and boys soccer head coach Dan Bushendorf each were named Section 3AA Coach of the Year. Assistant coach Brent Fairman was named Section 3AA Assistant Coach of the Year on behalf of the Kennedy boys' team. Seniors Makenzie Kane and Isabella Lone were selected for the girls' Class AA all-state first team. Seniors Diego Perez and Santiago Singer were selected for the boys' all-state second team. Diego Perez is a finalist for Mr. Soccer Class AA, an award given to the top player in the class. This week Kennedy Theatre presents performances of *Mamma Mia*.

## V. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Eric Melbye reported that he and other staff share information about the upcoming referendum renewal. Today, John Weisser and Dr. Jenna Mitchler presented at the Bloomington Noon Rotary meeting. Dr. Melbye will be sharing information at the Bloomington Chamber of Commerce board meeting this week. This is for a renewal of the soon to expire safety and technology levy that Bloomington voters generously approved in 2013. The district is not seeking anything more or new, just a straight renewal. Early voting is open at City Hall. The general election takes place November 8. Dr. Melbye encouraged all who are eligible to get out and vote.

District staff members have been meeting with our upcoming strategic planning facilitators to collect data and fine tune the process that will begin January 2023. A new strategic plan will help guide our work moving forward. Especially exciting is the public engagement part of the process where we will seek input from students, parents, staff and community members to complete the new plan. The planning process will be completed in late April/early May with the School Board reviewing the final product in late May or June. More information on opportunities to participate will be coming in the next couple of months.

Solar Energy Update

An update on our solar energy was given to the School Board by Rod Zivkovich, Executive Director of Finance and Support Services, and Tim Rybak, Director of Operations. A few highlights: The program began in 2015 and has a mix of onsite and offsite solar. The district participates in six (6) solar farms—Feely, Randolph, Felton, Lyman, Chub and Pickery. Four of our school sites have solar—Indian Mounds Elementary, Valley View Middle School, Jefferson High School and Kennedy High School. Currently, 30% of our 2018 (base year) is coming from solar. Proposals to 56% of our total 2018 load is to come from solar. As of March 2022, Bloomington Public Schools has realized a total saving of \$143,000. With all solar endeavors to date, a total of 2,264,405 pounds of carbon has been removed from the atmosphere; the equivalent of planting 17,105 trees.

Matt Dymoke highlighted the Jefferson Theatre performance of *Tinkerbell* and the Jefferson football game at TCO stadium, the Bloomington Sports Hall of Fame Banquet and upcoming performances of *Mamma Mia* at Kennedy High School. Heather Starks attended the game at TCO stadium and highlighted the subsequent news story. Beth Beebe attended the Bloomington Sports Hall of Fame Banquet. Mia Olson reported on tonight's meeting of the high school representatives of the Board Student Advisory Council where students participated in discussions of safe and supportive schools and chemical health; and, she highlighted the Early Childhood Parent Advisory Council fundraising event at Culvers tomorrow. Nelly Korman highlighted the AMSD conference being held November 10. Dawn Steigauf reported on a meeting of the Special Education Community Advisory Council at which topics discussed included staff shortages and goals.
