

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE SCHOOL BOARD INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT 271

I. ROLL CALL

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, and there being a quorum present, the School Board Meeting of Independent School District 271 was called to order by Chair Heather Starks at 7:00 p.m. on December 11, 2023, in the Arlene Bush Board Room at the Educational Services Center, 1350 W. 106th Street, Bloomington, Minnesota.

Chair Starks acknowledged that Bloomington Public Schools rests on the traditional, ancestral and contemporary land of the Dakota. The name of our state is Mni Sota Makoce, Land where the waters reflect the skies or clouds.

Mni means water; Sota means clear, but not perfectly so, cloudy. Makoce means a place, land, or country. Recognizing the land is an expression of gratitude and appreciation to those whose territory we reside on and a way

of honoring the Indigenous people.

Computer Science Coordinator, Dr. Alexandra Holter, attended a "Teaching Inclusive AI in Computer Science" event at the White House and also advocated for Computer Science at the US Capitol.
